TH212 Christology is a complex unit covering a wide range of doctrinal issues to do with the person and work of Jesus Christ. The candidates demonstrated reasonable proficiency with the exam questions made an effort to address the exam questions specifically.

Difficulties noted were:

- there was some confusion over the content of heresies in the historical questions
- the answer given for Q5 Outline the quests for the historical Jesus focused almost entirely on the Jesus Seminar and did not interact with the other stages of the quest
- some answers did not adequately deal with both parts of a question eg Q7 Write notes on two biblical metaphors, one metaphor was covered well, the other not so.
