

**BACHELOR OF MINISTRY (HONOURS) (AQF LEVEL 8 BACHELOR HONOURS DEGREE)**

<b>Course Rationale</b>
The Bachelors Honours program is designed for students who have graduated with a three-year undergraduate degree in ministry from the ACT and who have demonstrated high academic potential as a means of preparing men and women for advanced research in ministry.
<b>Admission Requirements</b>
<p><b>Academic Qualifications</b></p> <p>(i) Normally open as a degree to persons who hold the Bachelor of Theology or Bachelor of Ministry with a GPA of at least 2.0 overall, and 2.8 in the designated field of study to be pursued in the Honours program.</p> <p>(ii) All students wishing to enrol in the Bachelor of Ministry Honours program must have successfully completed at least 4 cps of Biblical languages in their initial degree in ministry.</p> <p><b>Language Qualifications for Non-English Speaking Background Applicants (NESB)</b></p> <p>Candidates who (a) have an assessable qualification that was undertaken solely in English in one of a set of prescribed countries OR (b) have been a resident in Australia with English being the language spoken at home and at work for ten (10) or more years are NOT required to provide proof of English language proficiency for consideration for admission to an ACT course. All other domestic and international candidates MUST provide proof of English language proficiency for consideration for admission to an ACT course. Such proof will normally be by provision of the results of an IELTS test (Academic Version).</p> <p>For admission to the Bachelor of Ministry (Honours), the minimum IELTS result required is 6.5 overall with a minimum of 6.5 in each subtest.</p> <p><b>Special Additional Qualifications</b></p> <p>(i) Non-ACT graduates with accredited undergraduate degrees in theology from members of the Council of Deans of Theology, achieved at an equivalent level as that required for ACT graduates in theology, may need to complete certain preliminary studies before embarking on the Honours program. The completion of language requirements, including biblical language exegesis, is one example of a bridging program that will be required if the program of study and the units to be taken require biblical language expertise.</p> <p>(ii) The ACT has a bridging policy with respect to graduates from certain accredited independent private providers. Generally such students would not be granted entry to the Bachelors Honours award. Such students would be encouraged to undertake bridging work in order to transfer to the coursework masters award of the ACT and from there to articulate to the postgraduate research awards through the MA.</p> <p>(iii) ACT Bachelor of Christian Studies graduates with a GPA of at least 2.8 will need to complete all requirements for the Bachelor of Theology (or Bachelor of Ministry) with a GPA of at least 2.8 overall and satisfy the requirement of a GPA of at least 2.8 in a the designated field of study to be pursued in the Honours program. Biblical language requirements will also need to be met for graduates seeking to enrol in the Bachelor of Theology Honours. On completing the above requirements the Bachelor of Christian Studies degree would have to be surrendered.</p> <p><b>Mature Age Entry</b></p> <p>There is no mature age entry provision.</p>

<b>Rules</b>										
i. Students enrolled in the undergraduate Bachelor of Ministry may be given permission to take an Honours unit provided that the candidate has 64 credit points in the degree and a GPA of at least 2.0. ii. Honours will be determined from the Honours course alone, and will not include the GPA of units taken in the prior undergraduate degree. iii. Candidates who achieve a mark of 40-49% in the thesis may be allowed to resubmit after taking into account the examiners' comments. The thesis will be submitted to the same examiners for a second result. A candidate may resubmit a thesis only once. A re-submission fee will be required. This is not claimable on FEE-HELP. If a passing grade is recorded for a resubmitted thesis, Third Class Honours will be awarded regardless of the grade. iv. Candidates may take no more than three years after the completion of their initial undergraduate degree in theology or ministry to complete the Bachelor Honours course. v. Students enrolled in the undergraduate BTh or BMin may be given permission to enrol in an Honours unit provided that the candidate has 64 credit points in the degree and a GPA of at least 2.0. If he/she does not proceed to the BMin(Hons), the unit will be credited to the BMin or BTh.										
<b>Criteria for determining the final honours level</b>										
i. The final grade of honours will be calculated by taking into account both the grades for the coursework units and the thesis ii.
